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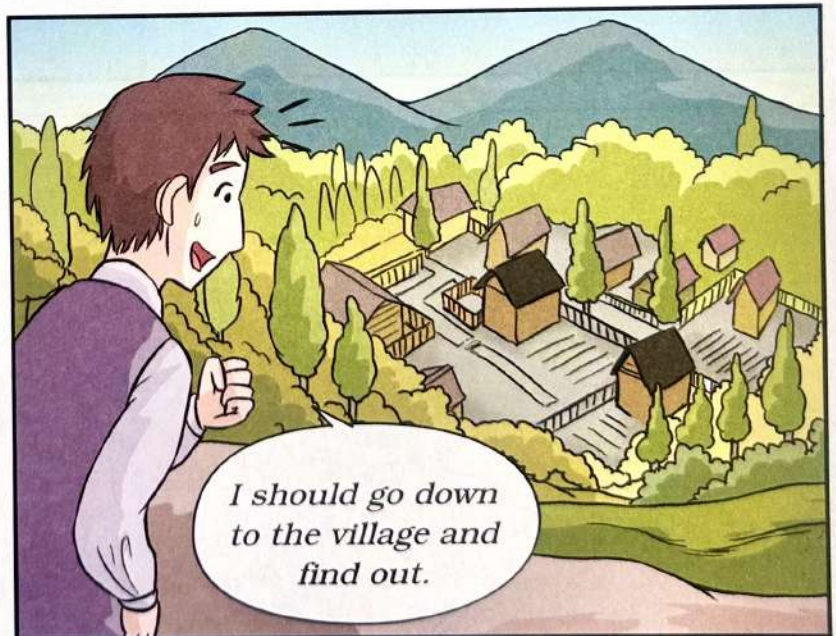
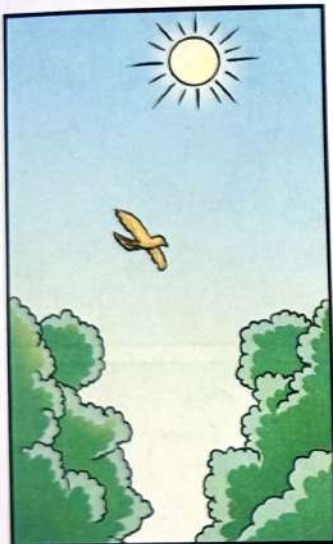

The maximum life span of a person is a measure of the maximum amount of time one lives between his birth and his death.

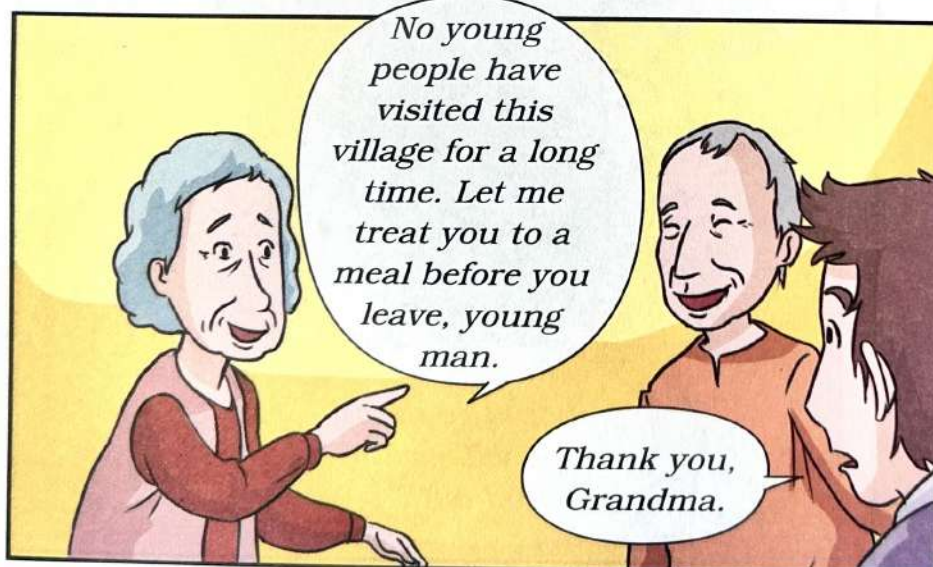
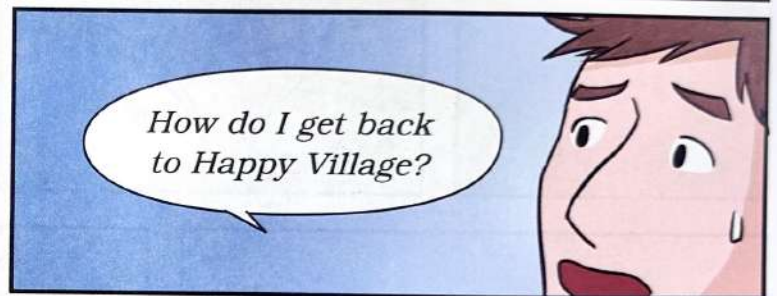
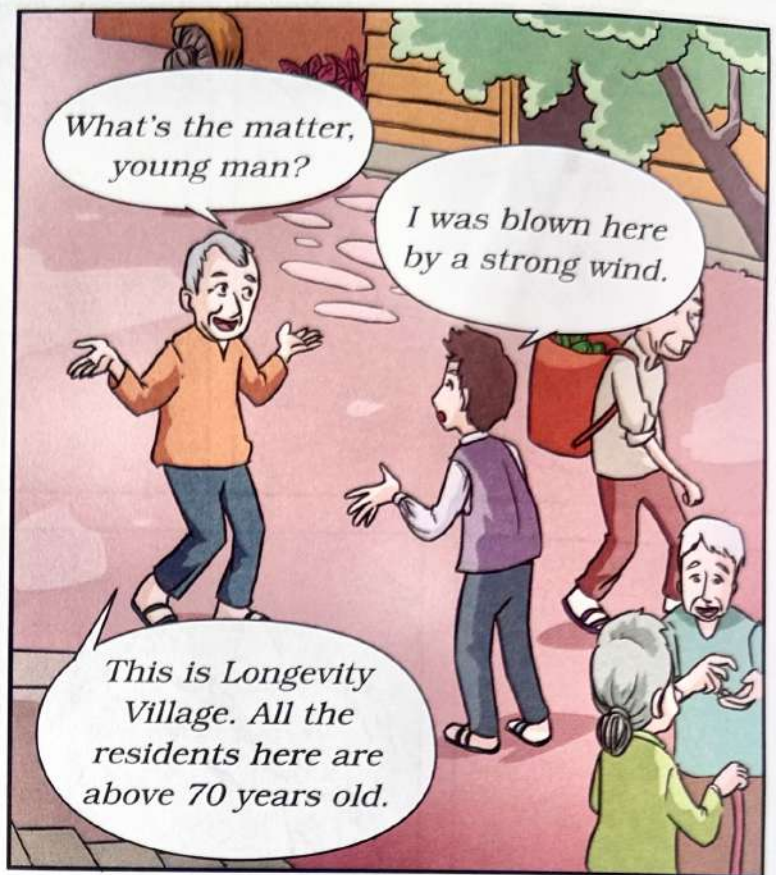
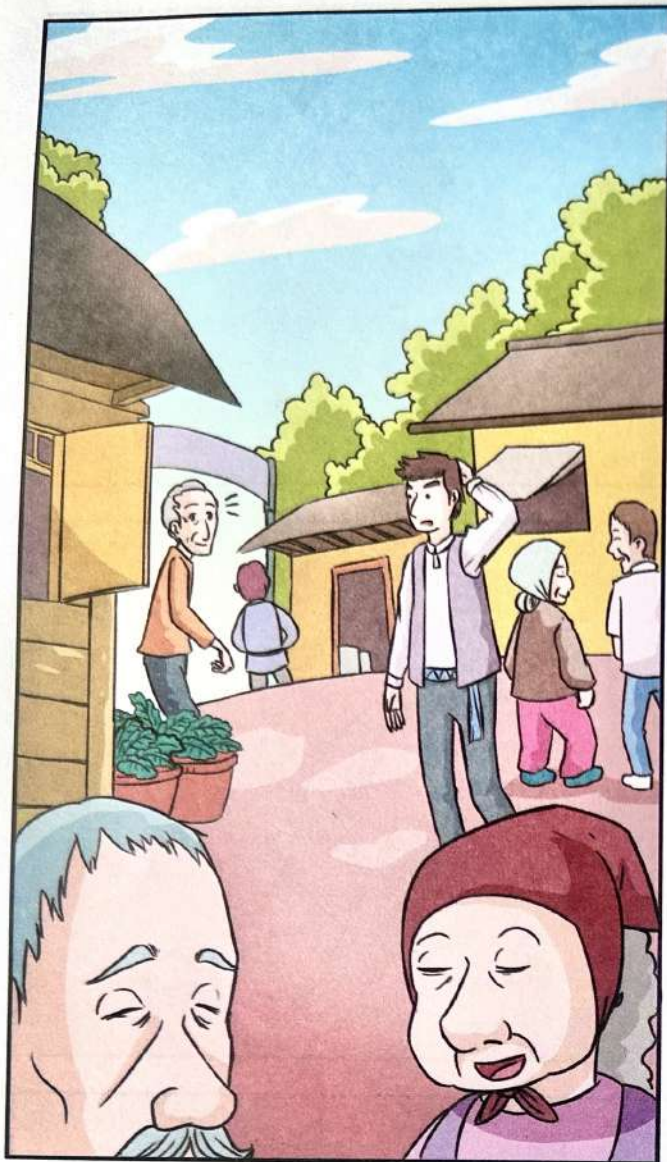




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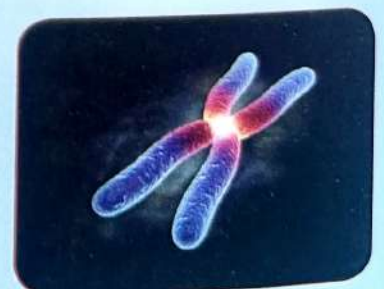
Life expectancy is a statistical measure of how long a person or organism can live, based on the date of birth, current age and other demographic factors which may include gender.

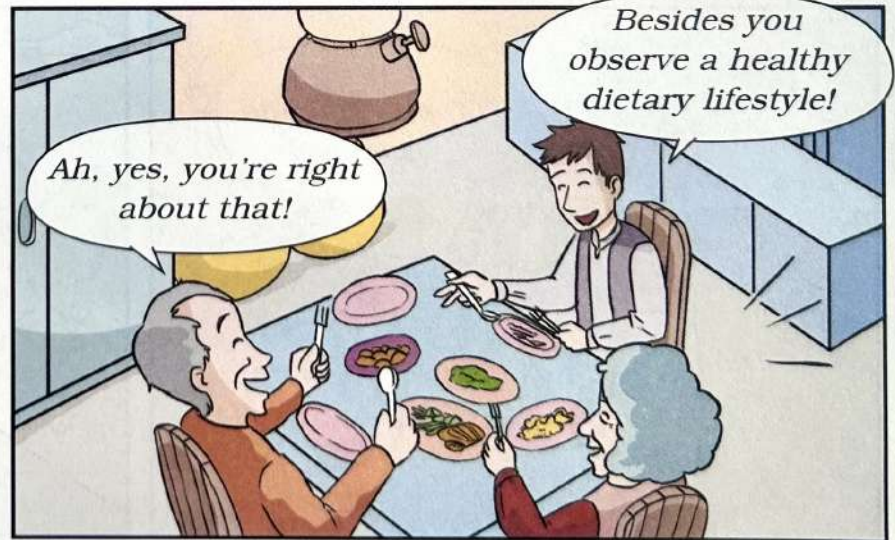

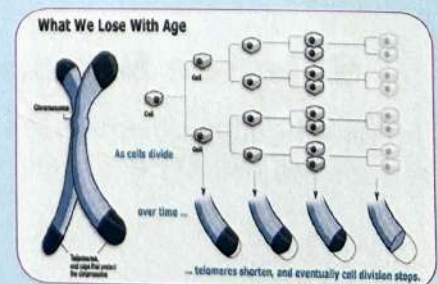
The Hayflick limit or Hayflick phenomenon is the number of times a normal human cell will divide until the cell division process stops.

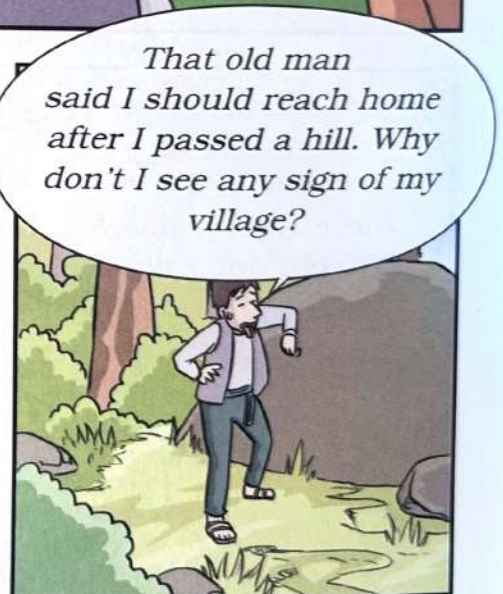
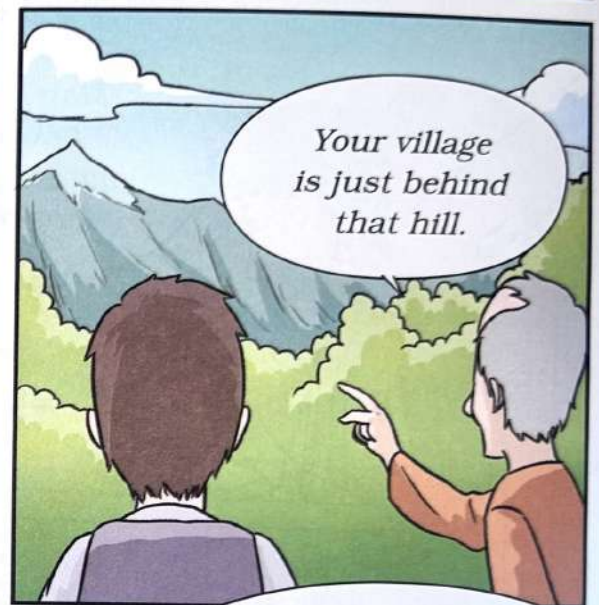

The telomeres associated with each cell's DNA will get slightly shorter with each new cell division until they shorten to a critical length.





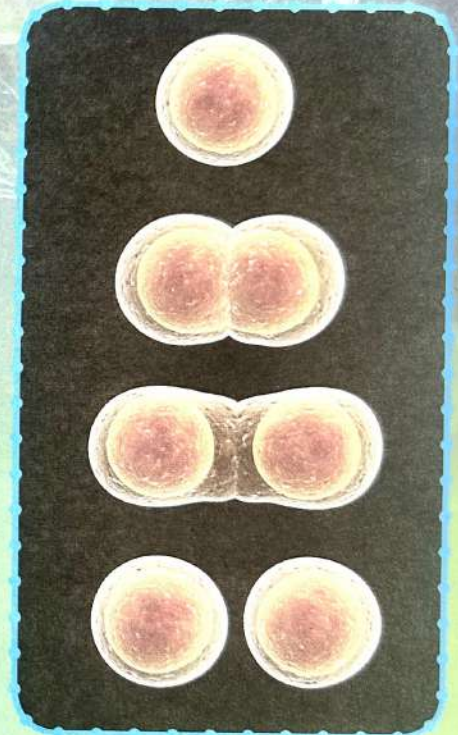
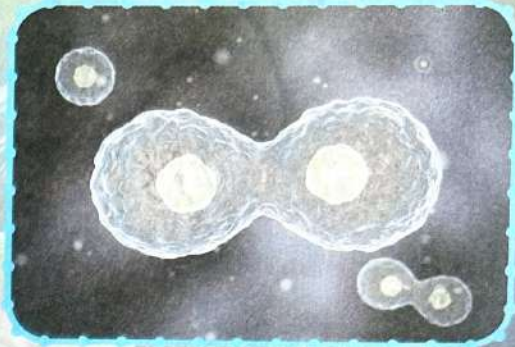

The Human Life Span

Researchers of life sciences believe that the limit to a human's life span is about 150 years and none can cross this age limit. They believe the primitive embryonic cell of a human can only divide itself 50 times. when the cell division limit is reached, a person's life will come to an end.
